Topical Talk

The news seems to have been dominated recently by football; love it or hate it you couldn't escape from it. I suppose being classed as the fourth best team in the world is not too bad and Gareth Southgate and his young team have done us proud.

Besides the football we have had Donald "Trumping" his way round the world. You just have to wonder that, out of a population of around 260 million, is this the best the American people can come up with: I'm sure there must be a sizeable number of US citizens who wonder what sort of path they are being led down.

Brexit is another hot topic at the moment – there seems to be an awful lot of talking but very little action that can be seen. Who would have Teresa May's job! From what I can see she seems to be getting very little support from her colleagues who should be helping her and an awful lot of sniping from others who should know better.

It seems that there are plans afoot to build space ports in the UK. The two furthestmost points of the country could become launch sites for vehicles into space. The government is planning a space port in Sutherland in the Highlands, only 30 miles from John O'Groats and also one at Newquay, about the same distance from Lands End. Rockets will be able to take off vertically from the Sutherland site and horizontally from Newquay airport. The government estimates that commercial use of these facilities could be worth in the region of £3.8 billion to the economy over the next 10 years. These will be a huge boost to the ability of our manufacturers to launch satellites for which we have a world wide reputation and launch us into the space age.

Clyde Space, a Glasgow based company that produces small satellite spacecraft, has said that having this facility in Scotland will bring huge benefits to Scotland.

Sorry if the "report" is a little short this time but I have just had a knee replacement which has slowed me down somewhat, but, with fantastic help and support from our friends and family I hope to be back in full swing next time. Luckily, at the time of writing, the weather is so hot and dry that I don't have to worry about the grass in the churchyard getting out of control, although I know that John will cope well with it whatever happens.

Pick was the eldest of five children born to a Congregationalist draper Francis and his wife Fanny. He was born on Nov 23rd 1878 at Bridge House, 26/27 Bridge St Spalding. He was rather bookish and preferred to read and build collections of moths and butterflies and things he found on the beach rather than do sports. His father, although a draper, had always wanted to be a lawyer and so he encouraged his son to follow this path.

His paternal grandfather, Charles Pick, was a farmer in the Spalding area and his maternal grandfather Thomas Clarke was a blacksmith, besides being a Wesleyan lay preacher.

To start his intended career in the legal profession Frank was sent to St Peter's School in York on a scholarship, but he failed to get a follow-on scholarship to Oxford. He was then articled to a York solicitor George Crombie, in March 1897 – he qualified in 1902 and then completed a law degree at the University of London: however, he did not seem particularly interested in a legal career and did not apply to practice.

Instead he began to work for North Eastern Railways, and was eventually assistant to the General Manager Sir George Gibb (1904). in the same year he married Mabel Mary Caroline Woodhouse – they had no children.

In 1906 his boss Gibb was appointed as managing director of one of the London Underground companies and he ask Pick to go with him, which he did. The company, known as Underground Electric Railway Co (UERL), which at that time operated only a portion of the underground system, was in financial difficulties and needed turning round. Pick became traffic development officer in 1909 and commercial manager in 1912. Gradually the business was turned around and other parts of the underground system were added, plus a number of bus and train companies: with a great deal of help and inspiration from Pick the company prospered.

In 1919, when things began to return to normal after the war he began to develop plans to further improve the transport system, particularly out into the suburbs. By 1930, with Government aid, the system had been greatly enhanced, all with Pick's management.

He had become joint managing director of the underground group in 1928 and when this group was taken over in 1933 he became Chief Executive Officer and vice-chairman. During the 1930's he continued to improve the London transport services – during 1938-39, with a new war looming, a lot of his time was spent planning the underground strategy for wartime operation.

But, due to some major disagreement, he retired in 1940, officially due to ill health.

Over the years Pick had been interested in design, this being shown by his success in turning the underground system around. He was involved in the establishment, in 1915, of the Design and Industries Association; this was established to try to improve industrial design by bringing manufacturers and designers together. Pick's involvement in this led to his giving lectures on the subject, and after the 1914-18 war he continued to give regular talks around the country: this continued during the 1920's and 30's. During his career he served on several administration and advisory boards.

In 1938 the government appointed him to plan transport operations for the evacuation of civilians from London in the event of war – these were then cancelled for a time when the threat of war subsided: they were then re-activated in 1939 when war became inevitable. He had a short spell at the Ministry of Information but that was short and unhappy for him, and so he left after four months and returned to the Ministry of Transport.

He had not been well for a number of years and the stresses of war work had taken their toll – he succumbed to illness and he died of cerebral haemorrhage in Nov 1941.

He has been described as a “giant of 20th century London in respect of transport”. Not bad for a “local lad!”.

It is not known what honours were offered him but it has been documented that he refused all “handles” to his name. When he was with the MoT in 1940 he refused Churchill's insistence that public information films should tell lies. “Can you tell me that you have never lied Mr Pick”, asked Churchill. An acquaintance of Pick's, Duff Cooper, relates that Pick could honestly say that he hadn't.

After Pick left No 10 Churchill turned to Cooper and said - “Who will rid me of this impeccable busman”.

Main Modifications Consultation

The South East Lincolnshire Local Plan was submitted to the Secretary of State in June 2017 for examination. The 'Examination in Public' commenced in October 2017 and was completed in April 2018.

The examination has resulted in some changes being required to the plan and therefore, we will be undertaking a six week consultation on the 'Main Modifications' to the Plan from 16th July to 28th August 2018.

Comments can only be made on the changes to the plan and, like the previous consultation in April and May 2017, must focus on whether they make the Local Plan 'sound' and compliant with legal and procedural requirements.
