# Seasonal Crime and Anti-Social Behaviour

We will be targeting types of crimes and anti-social behaviour which traditionally see a peak at this particular time of year.

## WHAT'S BEEN HAPPENING

#### **Seasonal Crime and Anti-Social Behaviour**

Particular types of crime see a rise at this time of year. Sneak in burglaries and theft from motor vehicles have seen an increase due to the warm weather, as properties and vehicles have been left insecure. There has also been an increase in theft of pedal cycles across the area. Late night and plain clothes patrols have been carried out to target these particular occurrences. Rural West officers played a part in securing three arrests in the last week in connection with a burglary in the local area.

Reports of anti-social behaviour traditionally peak at this time of year. There have been ongoing reports of youth related issues in the Kirton, Wyberton and Swineshead areas. The Rural West team are taking action against individuals involved in anti-social behaviour and have issued a number of anti-social behaviour warning letters. As well as this, we have been carrying out joint visits to addresses in partnership with colleagues from social housing landlords and the Boston Borough Council anti-social behaviour team to deal with ongoing issues.
